I am optimistic that October will bring cooler days and more enjoyable outdoor activities. And while our annual Halloween celebration will be absent from October, I am excited about new programs like our weekly outdoor <u>story time</u> and our new partnership with the Osher Life-Long Learning Institute (OLLI).

October also marks the beginning of the fiscal year for the City of Mountain Brook. In 2019, the City Finance Committee and City Council were very prescient in granting the Library's request for more funding for ebooks and audiobooks for children. When the Library closed in March, our digital collections became our only available collections. While circulation of all ebooks increased 80% during the Library's closure, circulation of ebooks for children increased 481%!

Even though the City of Mountain Brook faces uncertainty in the 2020-2021 fiscal year, O'Neal Library is scheduled to receive level funding for books, audiobooks, DVDs, and ebooks and downloadable audiobooks. In addition, the Mountain Brook Library Foundation, which has been instrumental in funding digital materials since the inception of that collection, has renewed its commitment to provide supplemental funding for ebooks and downloadable audiobooks and downloadable audiobooks and
